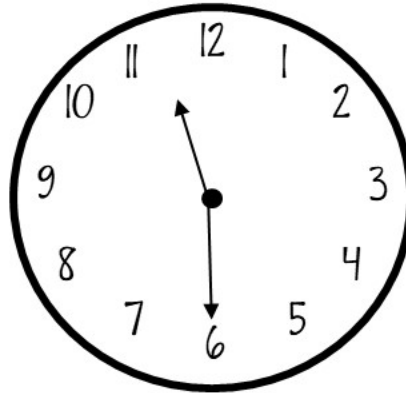

PACING

Please remember that this should be adjusted based on your kids. If they need to do less in a day or want to do more, please do not feel you need to follow this exactly. Go at the pace that works for you and your kids.

If your kids can't read yet, read the sentences in the reading activity to them for more great listening practice.

I have planned about 4 days for this lesson. Each day is very short especially compared to previous content. Here is an approximate schedule:

Always begin each day with greetings (Buenos días o buenas tardes, ¿Cómo estás?) and calendar time.

Day 1

1. Follow the instructions and script for Total Physical Response (TPR) using the flashcards with time written with numbers like 12:00.
2. Play a game: use this [set on Quizlet](#) or play *Memoria* (Memory), *Peces* (Go Fish), or *Matamoscas* (Flyswatter). You can find [instructions for these three games](#) on my website.

Day 2

1. Review vocabulary with TPR by saying the times (in a random order). You can use the TPR script as a guide, but don't say them in the same order as Day 1. You'll want to change up the order, so kids don't just memorize the times.
2. Complete PQA.

Day 3

1. Play a game to warm up: use the same [set on Quizlet](#) as the first day or play *Memoria* (Memory), *Peces* (Go Fish), or *Matamoscas* (Flyswatter).
2. Complete the reading activity.

Day 4

1. Play a game to warm up: use the same [set on Quizlet](#) as the first day or play *Memoria* (Memory), *Peces* (Go Fish), or *Matamoscas* (Flyswatter).
2. Play Kahoot. I created a kahoot (a trivia quiz) for the vocabulary for this lesson.

Log in to Kahoot, and search for "fosternm la hora" and you should see the quiz I made. You can then have your kids play the quiz. Kahoot is super easy to use. They made [a tutorial](#) that's about 1 minute.

If you don't have an account with Kahoot, you'll need to make one. It's free, but I know how annoying it is to make yet another account so skip playing this if you don't want to deal with it.

TIPS:

Continue to try to read for a few minutes each day. Reading is very important for language acquisition!

If your kids like games, don't limit to just one game each day. Play a couple!

Don't feel like you have to play all of the games either. If your kids love *Peces* (Go Fish) but don't want to play *Memoria* (Memory), then just play *Peces*. And you have my sympathy if that's their favorite game! 😊
