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TPR

As with everything, use a combination of the below resources and accompanying activities that will be most interesting for your kids.

Materials Needed:

1. Set of flashcards for each kid.
2. Pictures of places (on the printable "airport map activity")
3. Vocabulary worksheet with English translations.
4. Map (see printable "airport map activity")

TPR Instructions

1. Start with saying the first vocabulary word in Spanish and holding up the picture for it as you say the vocabulary word. Do this a couple of times.
2. Then, with the same vocabulary word, show the picture again while saying the vocabulary with the kids showing their flashcards of the place. The kids shouldn't talk yet unless they're choosing to say the vocabulary word. Again, do this a couple of times.
3. Continuing with the same vocabulary word, just say the vocabulary word (not showing the picture) and have the kids show the flashcard of the place. Again, do this a couple of times.
4. With the next vocabulary word, repeat steps 1 - 3.
5. After following steps 1 - 4 for each place, read the script on the next page and have kids act what they hear.

TPR

Script:

Here is a script for practicing the places in an airport. Without getting complicated, it's best in Spanish to describe what the person is doing and have kids act that out instead of giving a command.

Using the airport places, have kids use one of the dog, cat, or people cutouts on slide 7 of the airport activity or use an action figure to go to the places.

Say one place at a time using one of the sentence starters below, and then have kids go to the place in the sentence. Make sure to go through the list and use each place at least once.

For one kid:
(Name) va a _____ (place).

For 2 or more kids:
(Names) van a _____ (place).

la puerta de llegadas - the arrival gate
la puerta de salidas - the departure gate
la terminal - the terminal

la aduana - customs
la seguridad - security

For one kid:
(Name) va al aeropuerto, mostrador de embarque, or reclamo de equipaje..

For 2 or more kids:
(Names) van al aeropuerto, mostrador de embarque, or reclamo de equipaje .

Tip

After going through the places once, you can tell the kids to go to multiple places in a row.

For example:
Aidan va a la terminal y a la aduana.

Then Aidan goes to the terminal first and then to customs.
